Reception

Although impacted by Covid, you have been able to develop your arts policy, planning and practice in this area, ensuring you now study a wide range of artists. All staff have attended external CPD linked to equalities and diversity in the Arts. Your pupil outcomes are very strong, supported by your arts-rich curriculum, every child learning a musical instrument and a wide range of artists visiting the school and arts organisation visits. By ring fencing funding to ensure this happens, your arts provision is inclusive and not limited by parents ability to pay. Every child completes an Arts Award. You work with children to plan what arts they study.

Once again we welcome Tyler from 'All-stars' into school to support our Rugby development. The children are raring to go especially as we have a Tag Rugby tournament with the partnership this autumn! Matthew Senior and Liz Armstrong continue to develop cricket and Games across the school, and we are honing our swimming skills on Tuesdays at Ponteland Leisure Centre. A lot of PE whilst the weather is good!

Debbie MaCallister is also in school continuing to develop the social and emotional elements of learning through yoga! Kathy our wonderful music/peripatetic teacher also joins us again along with Anne Hedley who will continue to develop violin across Y2/3/4 in curriculum time. 


