Message from the Ministry Team By Rev. Elaine Jones

Happy New Year!

How quickly time seems to pass us by before we find ourselves at the beginning of yet another new season! It doesn't seem like five minutes since I visited the Upper Wansbeck and Mitford churches in the summer as a candidate for the role of Priest in Charge. I thank God that this was where He was calling me to, and I am honoured to be here with you as we excitingly move into a new season together.

As we face another new year and begin to work together with a new leader, sharing worship with our neighbouring parishes, we may be uncertain about change and the unknown. There are new faces in the pulpit and presiding at our Holy Tables. But it has been said that the only constant is change, that everything flows and nothing stands still. We look around us and that seems to be true. Seasons change. People age. Civilizations rise and fall. Is there anything that really stays the same? As we move through the seasons of the church, from Advent into Christmas and now into Epiphany, we are reminded of the ever-constant love of God in our midst through the seasons of change. Hebrews 13:8 reminds us 'Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever'. Jesus Christ, came into the world silently and without fanfare; yet as the world around Him moved and changed, the son of God remained faithful to God's promise.

I am also reminded when I step inside our ancient church buildings, of the generations of faithful people who have worshipped over the centuries. How different life is for us today than when our buildings were brand new! Yet, the thing that has remained constant is the desire to worship and serve God Almighty just as we continue to do today – even when it feels different! If our walls could speak, we would hear the cries of lament and joy; the prayers of sorrow and disappointment; the thankful tears of hope restored and fear cast-out echoing throughout eternity. And our voices will join them, permanently etched in the very fabric of those places of familiarity because the same holy, amazing, God who created the world has always been here, and He always will be.

Whatever we will face together this new year, may we be encouraged and remember that God is the same, Yesterday, today and forever! Our landscapes may change – but God is always with us! And that is Good News Indeed!

An extract from a sermon on New Years Day By Mrs Pam Walker - Associate Minister

I recently heard a joke, it went like this.

Disobey the laws of man, you go to prison

Disobey the laws of God, you go to hell

Disobey the laws of physics, you get a Nobel prize.

Being a nerd, it made me laugh, but like many jokes there is a lot in it, about creativity and defiance, even courage to find the truth. But one thing irked me, the popular belief that religion, Christianity, is about punishment, about hell. For this is the fear that the birth of Christ freed us from, the gift God gave us to show his love for us, the hope of redemption rather than the fear of punishment.

God's love for us is not about punishment but hope and encouragement, it is for us to decide how we respond but very importantly we have been given the gift of His Son, priest, teacher and role model to guide us.

At New Year we tend to assess the past year, what could we have done better, what went right, how do we resolve to be this year, what have we learnt?

The great comfort of Christianity is that every day, every moment, is as though it were New Year, a turning point in which we can change our lives, all we need to do is turn to God in all honesty and say "I am sorry help me do better today "

This is the promise of God's grace, loving, forgiving, providing that inner peace we need to face the world as we continue Christ's work, bringing justice to all and building the kingdom of Heaven on earth. Understanding this I want to finish with a well-known piece of poetry from Minnie Louise Haskins.

And I said to the man who stood at the gate of the year:

"Give me a light that I may tread safely into the unknown"

And he replied:

"Go out into the darkness and put your hand into the Hand of God.

That shall be to you better than light and safer than a known way"

So I went forth, and finding the Hand of God, trod gladly into the night.

And He led me towards the hills and the breaking of day in the lone east



Our Spring Term

Across school we have a number of wonderful things to look forward to in this coming term. At Belsay School we pride ourselves on offering

children a variety of experiences and opportunities to enrich their learning.

Reception

This half term in Reception we will be spending time thinking about our hopes and wishes for 2023. We will focus on the story '*The Polar Bears' Home'* by Lara Bergen. It allows us to discuss the issue of global warming, In the story two polar bear cubs are left behind because

the ice has melted quicker than they thought it would; thankfully they are reunited with their mother polar bear, but we have started to think about what we can do to help this happen at a slower pace. We will also continue our forest school journey- thinking about our environment and how we can protect this. We will focus on whittling skills and start by using potato peelers. We will then begin to use whittling knives to make lots of creations. We are very excited to start this!

Year 1 and 2

Year 1 and 2 will be learning about 'Sustainability' this half term during their study of 'The Tin Forest' by Helen Ward and Wayne Anderson. We will be learning about pollution and litter and how this destroys our environment. Together, we will think carefully about our local environment and how we can help prevent further damage. We look forward to organising a class litter pick and using the rubbish collected to make a recycled sculpture in art. We will also be writing rules in English for how we can look after our school wildlife area which we hope will help encourage more creatures to live there.

Year 3 and 4

This half term Year 3 and 4 will be focusing on our BIG question: 'How do festivals and worship show what matters to a Muslim person?' We will be exploring:

- What do we already know about Muslim people and Islam?
- What does the opening chapter of the Qur'an teach Muslim people about God?
- Why does prayer matter to Muslim people?
- Why is the mosque a special place for Muslim people?
- Why do Muslim people celebrate at the end of Ramadan?
- How do festivals and worship show what matters to a Muslim person? What can I learn from this?

This will allow the children to explore Islam further and compare it to past work we have done around Christianity.




A very happy New Year from everyone at Whalton School! We had a wonderful Christmas time at school.

News from Cambo School - by Paula Cummings Head Teacher



'Happy New Year to everyone from all your friends at Cambo First School'.

And what a start to the new year. Rain, wind and temperatures above average for this time of year! Seemingly December was the only month colder than usual in 2022; and the hottest ten months have all been in the last twenty years... A worrying statistic! So will there be any snow in 2023. I would say it is too early to say, but it

isn't looking good for the children!

It has been a strange return to school in 2023, e.g. later than usual and without a theatre visit; as this took place in November! However it was, and is, good to be back in school once again without all of those illnesses which were causing massive problems pre Christmas! [Fingers crossed they stay away!]!



This term in class 2 we are focussing much of our work on the history theme 'Stone Age - Iron Age.. A massive historical area! The children will be focussing on key questions e.g. Was it better to live in the stone age or the iron age? Was stone age man simply a hunter gatherer? How different was life in stone age times until the farm was developed? What can we learn from SkaraBrae? How much did life change and how can we know? To this

end the children will be working with Ancient Britain practitioners to connect to our landscape, environment and past



Our younger children are also finding out about Significant women within history, namely Grace Darling. I feel a visit to Longstone Lighthouse and the Grace Darling Museum will be on the cards for this



term to help us learn about Grace, her life, her achievements and the challenges she faced in life. We will also be working with that 'history bloke' to bring our learning to life via drama and role play!

Kathy Anderson and Anne Hedley continue to work with us once again. This term we will be learning songs linked to Easter and our current learning topic. We will also be fine tuning our whole school music playing through percussion, recorder, ukulele and Violins, even at lunch times! as Y3/4 will also be taking part in the Morpeth Big Music event, with children and staff from all of our partnership schools performing and appraising! We can hardly wait. The event was supposed to take place in 2020 however COVID meant it had to be cancelled, so it has been long waited for!


