Editor's Note:



Hello and welcome to our spring edition of Upper Wansbeck News.

I have an update on the introduction of a new Bus service that myself and others have been campaigning on for well over a year. A bus is to be introduced, and you can find details of the route on page 10.

However this falls a long way short of what we have been asking for and doesn't even include the village of Ogle!

The service will run twice per day on a Saturday only, linking the villages of Cambo, Hartburn, Midford, Scots Gap and Whalton with Morpeth as well as providing connections to Wallington Hall and Bolam Lake Country Park.

Ogle isn't included in the route because according to the council there is nowhere to turn a bus in the village and the bend in the road east of Belsay isn't suitable for large vehicles. So unfortunately Ogle is missing out!

According to the Council, the service is being funded from the regional BSIP and will be operated by Arriva North East using some spare time that exists (on Saturday only) between journeys on the 777 and X16.

If the service proves popular the council will look to build on the one-day-per week option, but whether Ogle will be included is another question! And one I will be asking.

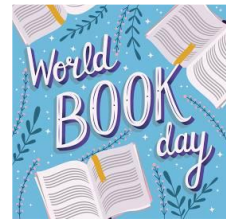
The Federation of Longhorsley and Whalton C of E Schools
